1983 Health FDC Mystery

In 1983, the design of the issued Health stamps used cats as the theme complimenting the previous year where dogs were featured on the Health stamps. The designer also did a first day cover to be marketed along with the stamps by NZ Post. Typically these covers are still very common and are easily acquired for under a dollar.



The design of the cachet on the issued cover used a longer haired cat, a Persian or similar, as the theme to compliment the stamps. However, there are a very, very small amount of covers known that use a different cat image in the cachet. Although it is clearly labelled as a "New Zealand Post First Day Cover", it features a slightly cranky (mischievous?) looking, short haired cat that is shown clawing up a mat to reveal the word "Cats".

The cover is a real mystery as there is no doubt it was a NZ Post production and which I believe was shelved in favour of the "cuter" look of the issued cover. Personally, I prefer the cranky cat.

One explanation I have been told is that a quantity of covers with the original design were sent out to post offices prior to the issue of the stamps. Possibly they weren't particularly well received by staff and consequently NZ Post asked for a alternative using a more benign looking animal in the design.



Subsequently, a few covers with the original cachet were used by employees when the stamps were placed on sale, thus creating a desirable variety. At least one of the few covers seen was postmarked Auckland so the usage wasn't confined to just Christchurch.

An aeroplane of the Aero Transport Company piloted by Maurice Buckley carrying as passengers the manager Bert Mercer and Mr W Fleming of Gore flew from Invercargill to Half Moon Bay in 22 minutes and circled over the area. They did not carry any mail but did drop newspapers from a height of 500 feet.

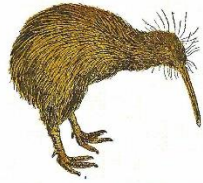

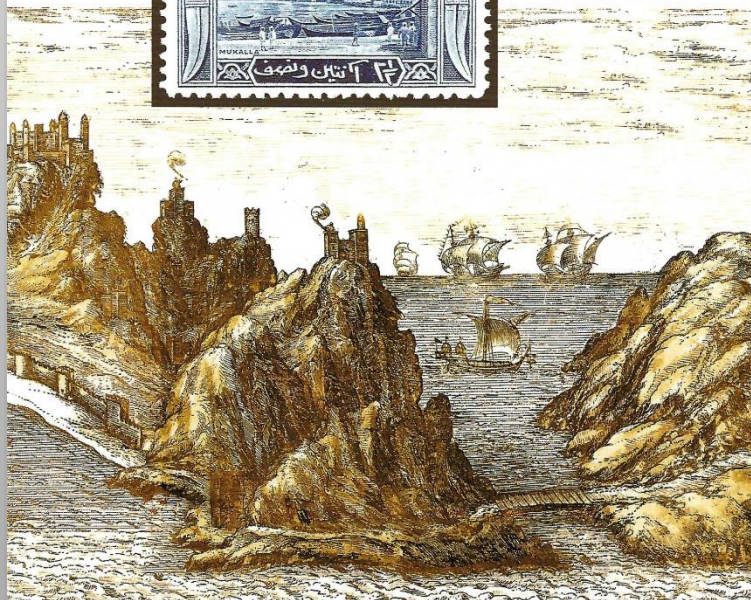

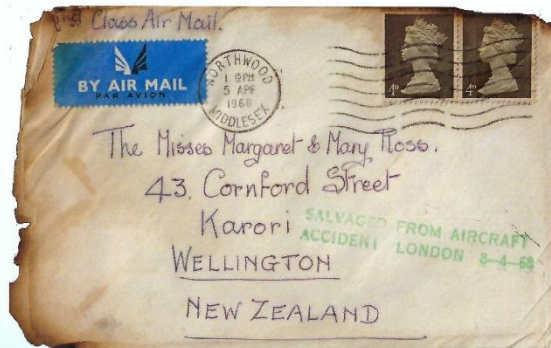

Known NZ Personalised Stamps 2020

Postal Rates increased on the 1st July 2020. The new denominations available for personalised stamps are \$1.40, \$2.70, and \$3.30.

Face value totals per denomination of p-stamps (singles) listed in the 2020 catalogue:

\$1.30 face: \$79.30	\$1.40 face: \$119.00	\$2.20 face: \$2.20
\$2.60 face: \$2.60	\$2.70 face: \$8.10	\$3.30 face: \$9.90

This gives a total face value of \$221.10. CAL collectors will remember the yearly CAL Packs available from NZ Post at the end of each year with a mint single of each CAL produced during the year. Much to the disappointment of many, these annual packs were going not to be provided for Personalised Stamps. Perhaps it is just as well, as there will be many more p-stamps produced we don't know of, and a full pack would be very costly!

NZ Post provided the following information re printing of Personalised stamps: Personalised stamps are printed by us at our own Whanganui facility on a Fuji Xerox Versant 3100 Digital Press. Red phosphor coated gummed and self-adhesive stamp paper is purchased from Tullis Russell in the UK. The paper is perforated (gummed stamp paper) or die cut (self-adhesive stamp paper) by Southern Colour Print in Dunedin and supplied to us in SRA3 (320mm x 450mm) size sheets. Following printing we trim to the final sheet size.

Stamp size: 30mm x 40mm Perforation Gauge of gummed stamp is 13.33 x 13.60

Very occasionally a "confetti flaw" is produced during printing. This is created by a paper chad being trapped within a page and falling off once printed. The chad occurs when the pins on the perforating comb need sharpening - fortunately, that doesn't happen very often as the pins are normally checked before use, but some are used more often than others. While these "flaws" aren't necessarily of great monetary value, they are an item of interest, as shown in the three examples below. Can you find the 'confetti flaw' in each example?



The range/purpose of p-stamps produced in 2020 has been pleasingly varied, with many FDC's noticeably showing a great depth of thought, effort, and quality printing. The last entry is an 'appendix' for 2019 - a stamp discovered during this year. If you know of any others stamps produced during 2020 that aren't listed, please contact us so they can be added to a 2020 Appendix.

1998 XVI COMMONWEALTH GAMES (Part 1 of 3)

Introduction

The Commonwealth Games is a multi-discipline sporting event involving athletes from the Commonwealth Nations. This event was first held in 1930 and has taken place every four years since except for 1942 and 1946 when they were cancelled due to World War II.

Nine nations have hosted the Commonwealth Games. Australia hosted five Games (1938, 1962, 1982, 2006 & 2018), Canada hosted it 4 times (1930, 1954, 1978 & 1994), New Zealand hosted it 3 times (1950, 1974 & 1990), Scotland hosted it 3 times (1970, 1986, 2014), England hosted it twice (1934, 2002), Wales hosted it once (1958), Jamaica hosted it once (1966), Malaysia hosted it once (1998) and India hosted it once (2010). Two cities have hosted it twice: Auckland (1950 & 1990) and Edinburgh (1970 & 1986).

To award the 1998 XVI Commonwealth Games, the Commonwealth Games Associations congregated at the Commonwealth Games Federation's General Assembly during the 1992 Summer Olympic Games in Barcelona, Spain. Each Commonwealth Games Association was entitled to one vote. After the votes were cast and verified by independent scrutineers, the President of the Commonwealth Games Federation would announce the decision to the Assembly and the people of the Commonwealth.

Kuala Lumpur was selected to stage the 1998 Commonwealth Games at the General Assembly of the **Commonwealth Games Federation (CGF)** in **Barcelona, Spain** on 21 July 1992. The 1998 XVI Commonwealth Games were the first held in an Asian country and the last **Commonwealth Games** of the 20th century. This was also the first time the games took place in a nation with a head of state other than the **Head of the Commonwealth**, and the first time the games were held in a non-English speaking nation. For the first time, the games included **team sports** and the Queen's Baton Relay to travel to other nations of the Commonwealth (other than England and the host nations). To show Kuala Lumpur's seriousness in bidding for the Games, the Organising Committee was instituted legally on 13 July 1992 under the name 'SUKOM Ninety Eight Berhad'. This was 10 days before the CGF's General Assembly congregated at Barcelona, Spain to select the 1998 XVI Commonwealth Games host.
